New Trailer

If you have listened to the repeaters recently, you probably heard talk about a new trailer. This all started when we found that there was to be an auction in July in Macomb of surplus trailers used in Louisiana after Hurricane Katrina. A few of us went to the auction site to survey the available trailers, which totaled around 400. Many were in very good shape and some were almost falling apart. We agreed that if we could find one for around \$1000, we should take it. On the day of the auction, Jim, N9AJV, and Jeremy, KC9KGJ, attended. Sales were brisk, with many going for \$3000 to \$5000. Later in the day, heavy rains attacked the auction. Most buyers left, or headed for shelter. Jim and Jeremy remained and found one trailer in almost perfect shape that went for \$1100 - to them! The rain helped a great deal. Several have agreed to share the cost of the trailer and we plan to convert it into a communication trailer. It will be available for use in the local area for any radio activities. All of the details are not worked out yet, but we are excited to have this for our use. The trailer is equipped with a toilet, shower, kitchen with stove and refrigerator, heating system, and air conditioning. All utilities appear to be in working order. We will post our progress as we continue to work on it.

Repeaters

Our local repeaters seem to be running well at present. There is a minor problem with the IRLP link on the K9BF, 444.525 repeater. It will not connect to reflectors, but it appears to connect to repeaters only. Wayne, AB9FJ, is looking into this issue. Our 146.76 repeater has not changed callsigns yet, but probably will soon. Ben, K9BF, is still working on the new controller for this repeater. He hopes to have it finished in the next few weeks. When it is installed, we will have more features on the repeater and much better control. The Echolink node will not be affected by the change. It should operate as it always has. Our W9YR D-Star repeater is seeing more use. We encourage all D-Star users to check into the Illinois D-Star Net on Wednesdays at 9 p.m. The net control is K9QZI. We also encourage participation in the Ozark net on Sunday evenings at 7 p.m. It originates in Ozark, MO. and we link to Reflector 001C for the net.

D-Star at ARRL

The ARRL Lab has installed a D-STAR (Digital Smart Technologies for Amateur Radio) repeater in the Lab at the ARRL Headquarters building. Operating with an output of 147.390 MHz, positive offset, the W1HQ D-STAR repeater is a local repeater with a modest footprint covering the Hartford-New Britain, Connecticut area. The antenna is on the roof of the Headquarters building with the repeater located in the Lab. With its gateway, the repeater is accessible to any D-STAR user on the planet. The Lab's call sign is W1INF.

"The purpose of the repeater is to better educate the Lab staff on D-STAR technology," explained ARRL Test Engineer Bob Allison, WB1GCM. "In turn, we will have the ability to handle some of our members' questions on the matter. We also intend to use this new technology when emergencies occur where D-STAR technology is deployed."

In the near future, the W1HQ D-STAR system will also include 70 and 23 cm repeaters, as well as a 23 cm high speed data link, once initial frequency coordination is granted. "We're especially interested in the high speed data link," Allison said. "Though it will have a limited range, we can begin experimenting with its potential and use it as a training tool for Lab staff."

Hamfests

As the Summer winds down, so are hamfests in our area. There were many good ones over the past couple of months. The Princeton, IL hamfest went well, changing to a one day event in June. Peotone, IL, hosted the usual 2 hamfests, one in July, and one in August. As in the past, the July event was smaller than the August weekend. Huntsville was excellent! It again occupied one room only, instead of the split location of last year. The one room is huge, and handles the crowd very well. Attendance appeared to be about normal, but sales were a little slow. The Missile Defence Command show was just prior to the hamfest, at the same location. Some of us arrived early enough in the week to visit this show. It was very interesting to see all of the military defence equipment on display. The weather was warm, but everything was inside the well-air conditioned Von Braun Center in Huntsville. Danville held their hamfest on the same weekend as Huntsville. Over Labor Day weekend, the annual Shelby Hamfest was held in Dallas, NC. As always, it was large and with lots of attendees. Dallas is just West of Charlotte. K9QZI and AB9FJ attended and enjoyed it. Several vendors from the Midwest were there as well. Golf carts were everywhere as they could be rented at the hamfest. The grounds are large enough that the carts were a welcome addition.

Coming up are Peoria, Belvidere, and Bedford. The Peoria Superfest is September 18-19, at the Peoria Expo Gardens. This is always a good one to attend. A week later, on September 25, the Radio Expo hamfest is at Belvidere. This is the hamfest that used to be at Grayslake. This year, it is one day only, Saturday. October 3 is the Bedford, IN hamfest.
